Born 21 February 1919, son of Alfred and Margaret Ellen Moore, of Altrincham, Cheshire.

Attended Seamons Moss Boys' Endowed School, Oldfield Brow, Altrincham. Later employed at a firm of South American Shippers in Manchester.

He had undertaken a total of 36 missions including the Norwegian Campaign and Germany as a Wireless Operator/Observer.

38 Squadron was flying from Shallufa 12/46, situated on the west bank of the Suez Canal - at the southern end before it meets the Red Sea.

He was reported missing on 14 February 1941 one week before his 22nd birthday on 21 February 1941.

Roll of Honour reports in the local newspaper state that he was buried at Aselipio Cemetery on the Isle of Rhodes.
